



## Part 1 Assessment Regulations for Level 5

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| 5.3.2. | In order to progress towards or gain a given award a student will have to have passed and gained credit for modules that meet the required pattern for that award as defined in the Award Pathway document.                             |
| 5.3.3. | In order to progress to Level 6, students must complete their Practical Skills Logbook.   |
| 5.3.4. | In order to progress to the Award Pathway for MSci a student will have had to either<br>(i) obtain an average mark of 60% or more for the level, or<br>(ii) obtain 55% for the level with a mark of at least 62% for the Project Report |

### 6. Consequences of Failure

- 6.1. A student who fails a module at the first attempt shall have a right to resit. S/he will be required to resit those pieces of work that were failed (with less than 40%) at the next available opportunity.
- 6.2. Where the student has not yet completed all of the modules in a Stage, s/he will be **required to resit** any piece of work with a mark of 30-39% in order to pass a module if it has not been passed on aggregate at the first attempt.
- 6.3. The module mark obtained at the second attempt will be no greater than 40%.
- 6.4. When a module resit involves a piece of assessed work, the amount of time the resit student is given to do that work should be the same as on the first occasion.
- 6.5. A student who has failed the year at the second attempt and **has not** previously repeated a year of

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9.2.	A student absent for any other reason will be awarded 0 (zero) for the assessment.
9.3.	Where a student has an allowable absence the assessment will be considered to be deferred until the next sitting or submission date except, where a student has an allowable absence for work amounting to no more than 12 credits of assessment, his/her overall mark for the level will be calculated pro rata.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Late Submission of Work</b>  Reports, Projects and Assignments submitted after the due deadline will be subject to the late Major pieces of work are specified in the Part 3 Assessment Weighting document and will be reduced to a maximum of a bare pass (40%) within the late submission window.
